Religious definition;

SUDDEN DEATH

- God's will
- Acceptance/denial
- Enquiries/investigations into cause of death
- Post mortems

- Increased number of visitors
- Recitation of the Holy Qur'an
- Procedure of laying out body

- Bathing
- Shrouding
- Funeral prayer
- Remembrance





BEREAVEMENT & THE MUSLIM COMMUNITY

- On hearing of a loss/bereavement
- Etiquette of grief
- Etiquette of condolence





THE ROLE OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

- Awareness of death and dying but require that bereavement support
